Literacy

Children will develop a love of reading through daily reading with an adult, shared class stories and performing poems and songs.

- Show interest and answer simple questions about the text
- Use words that are familiar to check reading makes sense
- Find and recall the title
- Read some common irregular words
- Solve simple words by blending sounds and check what has been read makes sense and sounds right
- Use picture clues to help read a simple text.
- Predict and anticipate key events based on illustrations, story content and title.
- Understand the structure of a non-fiction book is different to a fiction book.

Phonics:

Phase 1: Begin to orally blend and segment

Phase 2: Set 1: a-z, special friends Tricky words: I, go, to, the, into, no

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Children will take part in daily Worship and become familiar with their Key Person.

SCARF: Keeping myself safe

- What's safe to go in my body?
- Keeping myself safe
- Safe indoors and outdoors
- Listening to my feelings
- Keeping safe online
- People who help to keep me safe

Communication and Language

Children will gain confidence to interact in conversations with adults and peers

- Develop vocabulary by listening to and retelling stories in their play
- NELI interventions to support using language well
- Ask how and why questions by investigating the world around them
- Retell a story with story language
- Remember key points from a story
- Ask questions to find out more and to check they understand what has been said to them.
- I can describe events (Chinese New Year)
- Listen to and talk about stories to build familiarity and understanding.
- Learn rhymes, poems and songs.

Physical Development

Children will understand the importance of physical movement to lead a happy, healthy and active life.

- Enjoy exploring a range of movements and persevering with skills such as hopping, skipping and jumping.
- Move energetically
- Copy basic actions
- Move to music
- Negotiate space
- Perform teacher led warm ups
- Developing independence when dressing in the role-play area and when getting changed for PE.
- Gaining more control when holding and using tools and equipment to mark-make, draw and form letters correctly

Expressive Arts and Design

Children will have opportunities to show their imagination and creativity and develop skills to support artistic and cultural awareness

- Explore how colour can be changed
- Talk about a famous artist.
- Making lanterns, Chinese writing, puppet making
- Recognise, create and describe pattern: animal prints and textures

Mathematics

Children will begin to build vocabulary to name, describe and explain their understanding of numbers, shapes, space and amounts.

- Understanding Zero
- Comparing numbers to 5
- Composition of 4 and 5
- Mass and capacity
- Growing 6.7.8
- Making pairs and combining groups

Understanding the World

Children will be encouraged to make sense of the world around them by exploring nature, meeting members of the community and exploring places beyond school.

- Use images, video clips, shared texts and other resources to bring the wider world into the classroom and discuss what they see
- Describe what things they have seen whilst outside, including plants and animals.
- Celebrate Chinese New year
- Recognise that people have different beliefs
- Respecting difference
 - Talk about lives of people around us
- Talk about experiences at different points in the year (class calendar for each month)
- Changing seasons: winter
- Ice experiments
- Knowing there are different countries in the world (China)
- Explore google earth
- Understand the effects of changing seasons on the world around me
