Literacy

Children will develop a love of reading through daily reading with an adult, shared class stories and performing poems and songs.

Show interest and answer simple questions about the texts, use

Use words that are familiar to check reading makes sense Solve simple words by blending sounds and check what has been read makes sense and sounds right Use picture clues to help read a simple text.

Predict and anticipate key events based on illustrations, story content and title.

Writing for a purpose: lists (Things I need to take to the moon), map making (labelling animals and areas of the farm), make a poster (how to care for our planet), write a card (birthday card, Ramadan and Jubilee, Father's day)

Communication and Language

Children will gain confidence to interact in conversations with adults and peers

Children will be introduced to 'Helicopter Stories' to promote and develop their vocabulary by listening to and retelling stories. They will gain confidence when performing their stories in small groups.

NELI interventions will be delivered to support and develop vocabulary, listening and narrative skills.

Children will learn rhymes, poems and songs linked to our themes: **Journeys and Superheroes**.

(Zoom Zoom, Astronauts and Rocket Ships, Superworm, If You're Super and You Know it) Children will describe special events and celebrations and link their understanding to new special experiences (Queen's birthday & Jubilee, Ramadan) Listen to and talk about stories and non-fiction books to

build familiarity and understanding of the world around them. (What can I see in the sky? What do I know about farm animals?)

Children will continue to practise and consolidate key skills: subitising, counting on and back within 10, composition, sorting and matching, comparing and ordering.

Children will have opportunities to show their imagination and creativity and develop skills to support artistic and cultural awareness

Creating collage representations of places inspired by stories and familiar experiences. Using vocabulary to talk about their pictures and choices.

Physical Development

Children will understand the importance of physical movement to lead a happy, healthy and active life.

Children will be introduced to 'Doodlesticks' a music and movement programme used to develop strength and coordination in shoulder, arm, wrist, and finger muscles to support handwriting.

Children will demonstrate strength, balance and coordination and continue to develop fundamental movement skills during the gymnastics and dance units.

Understanding the World

Children will be encouraged to make sense of the world around them by exploring nature, meeting members of the community and exploring places beyond school.

- Use images, video clips, shared texts and other resources to bring the wider world into the classroom and discuss what they see.
- Describe what things they have noticed whilst outside, including plants and animals and changes to the environment around them
- o Celebrate Ramadan, St George's Day, Earth Day, The Queen's Birthday and The Queen's Platinum Jubilee
- o Recognise that people have different beliefs and respecting differences
- o Using 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' to talk about different environments and how we can care for our environment.
- o Talk about experiences at different points in the year (class calendar for each month)
- o Changing seasons: Spring into Summer
- Exploring Space: What is in the Solar System?
- Use a map to locate areas and objects.
