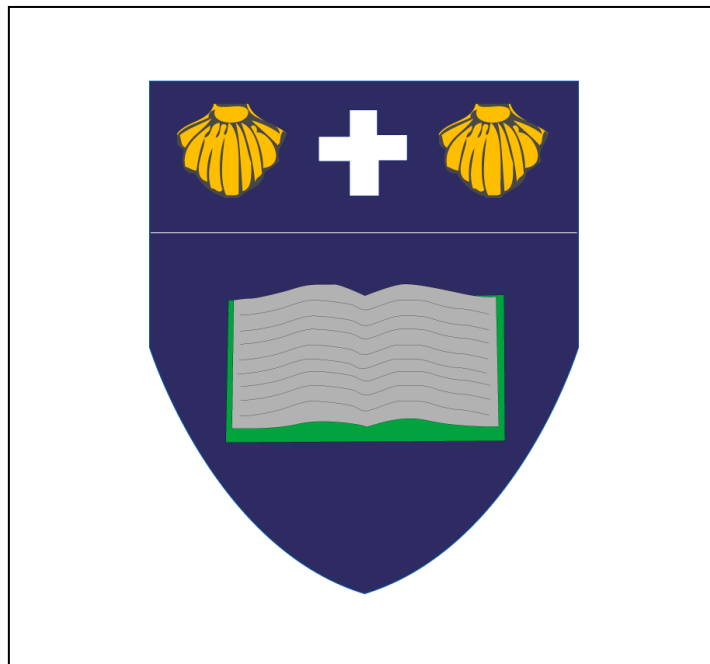

School Uniform Policy

Rationale

We believe that the wearing of uniform encourages children to have a sense of belonging and of being part of the community, which impacts positively on their wellbeing. It is an outward expression of the school's identity and promotes a feeling of pride and equality. In addition, we believe that the wearing of a 'uniform', as opposed to leisure wear, contributes to helping children understand that they come to school to work and learn.

Aims

- To ensure that children wear clothing which is safe and practical.
- To promote pride/ambition in their school and a sense of identity.
- To promote the idea of Westleigh Methodist Primary School as a learning community and we expect exceptional standards.
- To promote the image of the school within the local area and the town.
- To eliminate competition amongst children in relation to what they wear (preventing bullying).
- To ensure that the uniform is simple, high quality and reasonably priced.

Keeping the Cost Low

The school has a dress code that helps identify everyone as part of our school team and encourages pride in the school. Uniform can be expensive and so, here at Westleigh Methodist Primary School, we strive to keep the cost lower for families. Our supplier for logo branded items is Rainbow and A&H Rosenfields. However, families should not feel obliged to buy logo embossed items. All the major items of dress can be purchased from local supermarkets. Uniformity, a shop in Leigh, sells pre-loved uniforms. Families can purchase fleeces and sweatshirts with the school logo from local school uniform providers.

Uniform Requirements

- White polo shirt
- Navy blue sweatshirt or cardigan
- Y6 pupils wear teal blue sweatshirt or cardigan
- Grey trousers, skirt or pinafore dress
- Grey or black socks, or grey or black tights
- Black shoes, not boots
- In Summer, your child may wear a white and blue gingham dress
- Hair must be tied back with a blue or black hair bobble.

P.E. Kit

All children should have a change of clothing for P.E, kept in a drawstring bag, clearly labelled with your child's name on the outside, as follows:

- Coloured crew neck PE t-shirt

(Your child will be allocated a colour of shirt that they will stick to during their time at Westleigh. This will either be **RED, GREEN, YELLOW, or BLUE** and will relate to the house that your child will be in)

- Plain navy shorts or joggers depending on the weather
- Plain navy zip up jacket/hoody
- Plain black trainers or pumps with no coloured logos or patterns.

P.E. kit should be left in school and will be sent home half termly.

Swimming Kit

All children should bring in, for swimming, the following:

- Swimming costume (no bikinis)
- Swimming trunks or shorts (must be above the knee)
- Towel

If your child has a verruca/wart on their foot, they are to wear a verruca sock for the swimming lesson.

Health and Safety

There are several health and safety issues which inform our school policy as follows:

- No jewellery should be worn except a wristwatch.
- Children with long hair need to have their hair tied back.
- No make-up is to be worn in school, including nail varnish and stick on tattoos.
- For pierced ears only stud earrings one per earlobe and these should be removed for P.E. (If children are unable to take studs out themselves these should be left at home on P.E. days. School staff are not permitted to remove any earrings). **In line with the local high school, we do not cover up earrings with plasters during PE.**
- Please ensure all of your child's clothing is named clearly, at all times.
