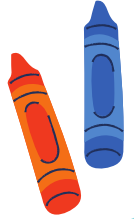

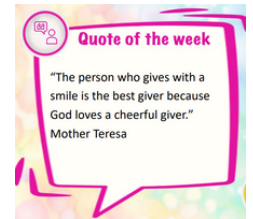


Epworth Worship Together
