Make a Wisdom Jar

Create a "Wisdom Jar" at home. Each family member can write down a piece of wise advice or something they learned during the day and add it to the jar. At the end of the week, read them together as a family.

Wisdom from Elders

Encourage your child to ask older family members or friends questions like:

"What wise advice would you give me?"

"What is the wisest choice you've ever made?" Your child can then reflect on or share what they've learned.
