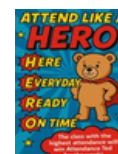
Our School Vision :

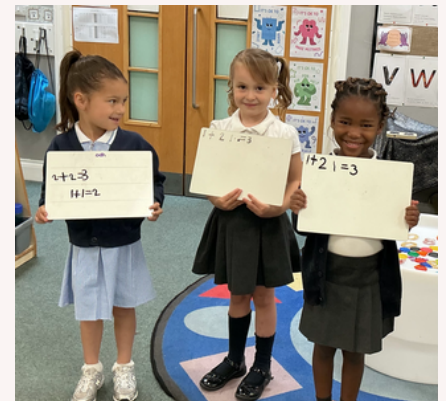
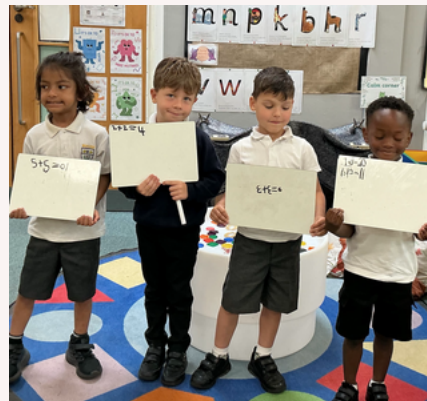


Nursery

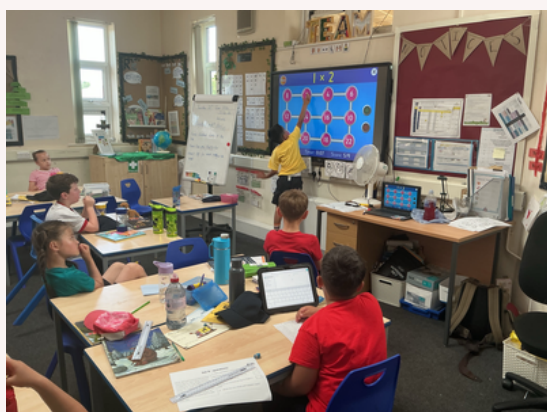
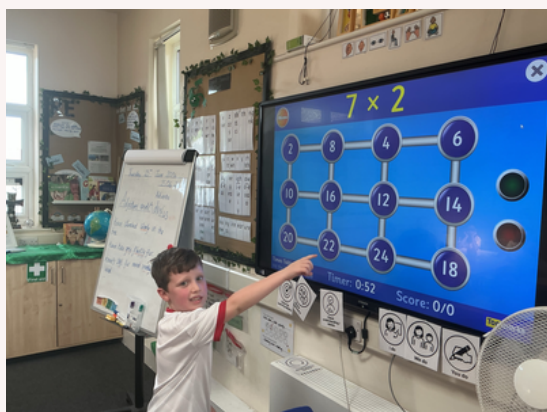
Y1

Y3

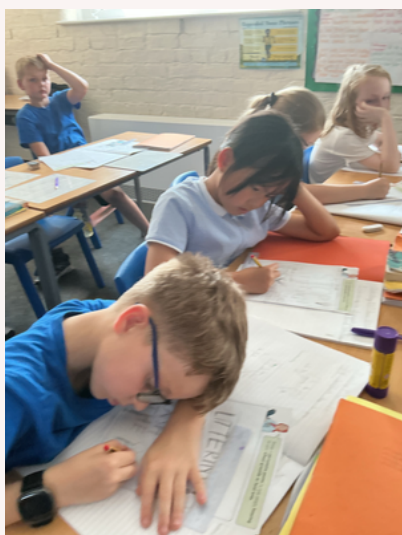

Y6



Year 6 have been helping to organise and support events while also taking part enthusiastically in all of the activities. They demonstrated excellent teamwork, responsibility and encouragement throughout the day.

In Science, pupils have been conducting practical investigations linked to light. They have been learning about incidence, exploring how rays of light behave when they hit a mirror and investigating the relationship between the angle of incidence and the angle of reflection.

In History, Year 6 have been exploring what Mayan city-states looked like. Using a range of historical sources, pupils have interpreted the significance of different buildings and considered what these structures can tell us about Mayan society, religion and daily life.
