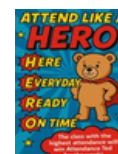
Our School Vision :

Nursery

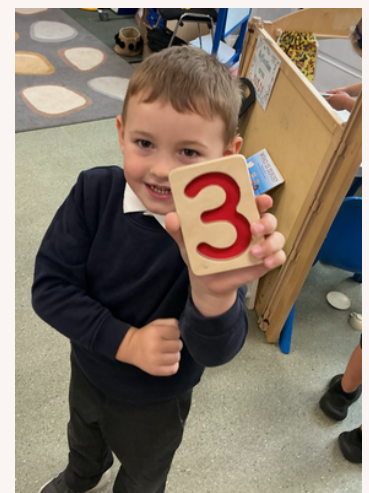
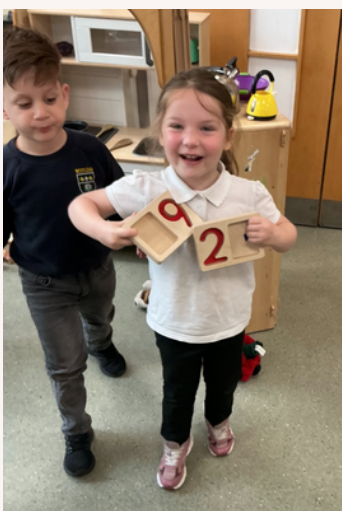


This week nursery have read the book animal hide and seek. We helped the farmer to clean his dirty animals and developed our fine motor skills

Y2



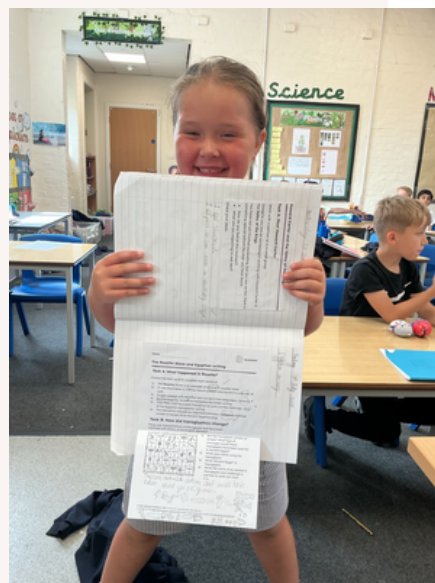
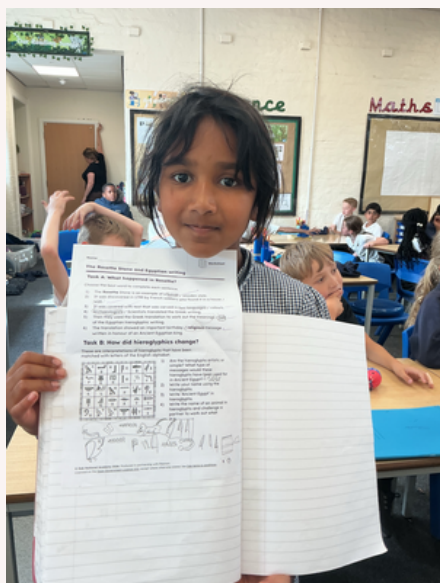
Year 2 used positional and directional language in Maths to move around a space.

Y4



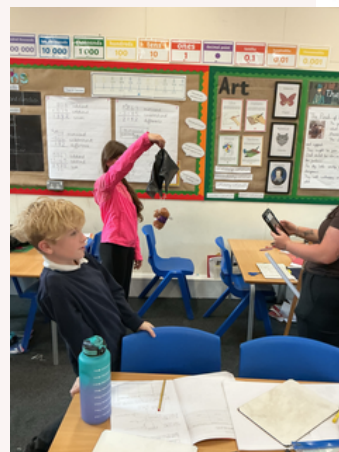
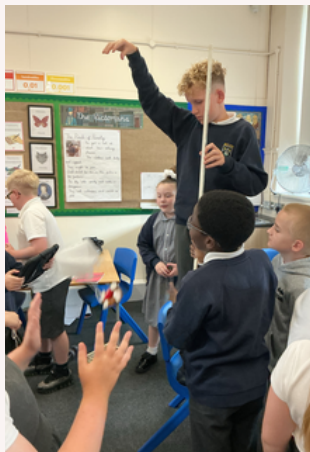
Year four are sounding great in their final music practice before their final performance of the year.
