What is chaplaincy?

A chaplaincy works primarily to show God's love in a school setting, by supporting the spiritual and emotional care of school staff, children, and their families.

1 John 4 v 16 - "God is love, and all who live in love, live in God, and God lives in them"

We're also here to support the school's Christian ethos; to offer prayer and guidance, to encourage creativity and curiosity about spiritual well-being and meaning in life. We can help your child explore their individual spirituality and grow in knowledge of the Christian faith that underpins our school.

The school family gathers for collective Christian worship on a regular basis, and each classroom has its own reflection area based on the core values of our faith; love, teamwork, thankfulness, generosity, peace, forgiveness, equality and justice.

Chaplaincy is a bridge between school and church, but also encourages school to connect with and serve the wider community, including other faiths, community groups and charities; expressing God's love through action and social justice.
