School Chaplain's Update from Vicky Tyrrell

You might have noticed on Twitter, we've been collecting seeds from plants in the school garden and are taking part in a community seed swap next weekend.





SEED SAVING TIPS on the vine until brown. You can also store the entire down in a warm area until pods dry out. Cross-ould affect the purity of the bean seeds in the future. Collect seeds when fruit dies and when the fruit separates easily. Remove the membrane of the seed by rinsing and gently rubbing with fingers. larvest seed when cucumbers are fully ripe and yellow. ollect seeds when plant begins to shrivel. Dry out seeds. Peppers from the same species could cross ause they will progressively fall off from the bottom to top. D save seeds from plants that bolt too soon because the seeds duce future plants that go to seed prematurely. Remove seeds 3 weeks after harvesting. Varieties within the same species could cross. Rinse off membranes and dry well. touch. Remove the protective cover covering the seed. Cross pollination may occur with wild or currant tomatoes, but most opular types will not cross. ollect seeds when plant dies. Peas do not cross-pollinate. Remove fibers and membranes by rinsing. When dropped into a glass of water, viable seeds will sink to the bottom. Seeds that float may not germinate well.

It is part of a wider FREE family event called "Leigh Fun Palace" and is taking place at The Turnpike (above Leigh Library) from 10am - 5pm on Saturday 2nd Oct

If you have any seeds you want to bring along and swap at the Fun Palace, you'll be more than welcome, and there'll be volunteers on hand to chat and give advice about general gardening
