COVID Updates

- Please refer to any 'Warn and Inform' letters sent home via Parentmail.
- To keep our school community as safe as possible could we please ask that you wear a facemask when picking up/dropping off children in the school yard and also if you need to call in to the school office.
- If any children in school display symptoms we will contact parents to come and collect them. PCR tests must be taken if displaying symptoms as you cannot rely on a lateral flow test.
- All adults who are fully vaccinated and children aged 5 to 18 years and 6 months, identified as a contact of someone with COVID-19 should take a lateral flow device (LFD) test every day for 7 days instead of self-isolating. Daily testing by close contacts will help to slow the spread of COVID-19.
- People who are self-isolating with COVID-19 have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with an LFD test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not

have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6. The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken 24 hours later. All test results should be <u>reported to NHS Test and Trace</u>. If the result of either test is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days (24 hours apart) or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest. Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10-day period of self-isolation.
