Worship

This week in worship we have been exploring the theme 'bouncing back.' The children shared lots of examples of situations where they have had to bounce back and show resilience, including learning to ride a bike, riding a horse and dancing.

Resilience is one our core behaviour values.

We then related our own experiences to the story of Moses. We learnt that when Moses was born, the Pharaoh had decided that all male children must be killed so that they could not grow up to fight him. Moses' mother put him in the river and hoped that he would be saved by God. The Pharaoh's daughter found Moses in his basket made of reeds. She decided to protect the baby.

The children were brilliant at deciding how the Pharaoh's daughter showed resilience in our story.
