#### <u>Worship</u>

In Worship this week, we have learnt about Saint George, the Patron Saint of England and we celebrate St. George's Day on April 23rd — the anniversary of his death in 303 AD – England's national day. A patron saint is a person regarded as the special guardian of a group of people. We discussed what it means to be brave and show resilience in the face of adversity. We learnt how Saint George was brave and continued with his Christian faith despite the threat of prison and death. We also talked about how we have the England flag flying at school to celebrate and remember Saint George's Day.
