Compare Walter Tull to Marcus Rashford and learn about his activism and achievements as an inspirational individual from today.

Find out about the sinking of the Titanic and find out what life was like onboard the ship. Investigate what life was like for the rich and for the poor and link this to the difference in classes/ floors on the Titanic. Discuss how the conditions were different depending on what class you were in - link this to learning about society attitudes in 1912. Investigate what caused the Titanic to sink. Discuss how there were different factors that may have contributed to the event. Discuss how safety on ships has since improved. Look at how transport has developed over time and compare old and new forms of

## Seacole and Edith Cavell

Study the lives of Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole and then compare to Edith Cavell. Learn about the Crimean War (where Nightingale and Seacole served) and WWI (where Cavell served - link to pupils prior learning from Autumn 2) and discuss similarities and differences of these two wars. Discuss how these individuals helped to change conditions in hospitals and compare to modern day hospitals, looking how the conditions have improved.
