What a fantastic Autumn term we have had together learning and growing realising 'With God, all things are possible'.

Communication and Language:

During World Nursery Rhyme Week, we enjoyed learning and singing a different nursery rhyme each day and used actions, props and role-play to understand the rhymes. We talked about our favourite songs by saying the sentence 'My favourite song is...because...'.



We used large construction materials to create the Big Ship on the Ally, Ally-Oh!

Physical Development:

We have explored different movements and actions when moving around the outdoor area. After listening to the story 'The Gingerbread Man', we explored different movements to escape from the Little Old Woman by skipping, hopping, jumping, crawling and slithering!

Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

During Circle time sessions, we have enjoyed sharing experiences and using Tapestry to look at photos. We are learning to take turns and listen respectfully to our friends.

Literacy:

We have loved listening to 'The Gruffalo' and 'The Gingerbread Man'. We added different materials to the playdough station and created our favourite characters from the stories. We then used vocabulary to describe different features.

Mathematics:

We have been identifying and describing repeating patterns and creating our own patterns using natural objects found around the garden and also creating a sequence of repeating movements using body actions.



Archie created a repeating pattern using conkers and rocks.

Understanding the World:

We have enjoyed learning about celebrations, festivals and special occasions. We listened to the story of Rama and Sita and used puppets to retell the story using new vocabulary.

Expressive Arts and Design:

During the Christmas Spectacular Day we used a range of skills to create decorations. We designed our own Christmas cards and used scissors to cut out shapes; we mixed ingredients to make salt dough and painted patterns on them.
