English

As readers, we will continue to develop our VIPERS skills through answering questions on our book as a hook and a range of comprehension texts.

As writers, during Autumn 1, our book as a hook is 'Escape from Pompeii' by Christina Balit. We will be writing a variety of genres including narratives, poetry, newspaper reports and diary entries. In Autumn 2, our book as a hook is 'The Firework Maker's Daughter' by Phillip Pullman. We will continue to develop our writing skills by producing character descriptions, letters, instruction texts, narratives and poetry.

Maths

As mathematicians, we will be developing our understanding of number through the areas of place value, addition and subtraction and multiplication and division. We will be using a concrete, pictorial and abstract approach alongside learning mental and written strategies to help us to answer questions and complete challenges in these areas.

We will be learning how to order, compare and identify numbers up to four digits, add and subtract numbers up to four digits using a formal method and solve addition and subtraction word problems. We will also be learning to how to recall and use multiplication and division facts up to 12x table and multiply two and three digit numbers by a one digit number.

Religious Education

For Autumn 1, our RE focus question is 'Can religious teachings help us decide the best way to live?'

Spiritual: We will explore the importance in religious traditions of rules that are sacred and come from God.

Moral: We will consider the rights and wrongs of obeying rules and the consequences for ourselves and others.

Social: We will evaluate the impact of rules from religion and belief on a person's daily life.

Cultural: We will enquire into the codes for living in different religious traditions.

For Autumn 2, our RE focus question is 'How is Christmas celebrated in other cultures?'
Spiritual: We will express our own response to Christmas through art, carols and music.

Science

As Scientists, during Autumn 1, we will be learning about animals including humans. We will describe the simple function of the digestive system and identify the different parts, identify the different teeth and their functions and construct and interpret food chains.

During Autumn 2, we will be learning about sound. We will identify how sounds are made and explain how sound travels, identify ways to change the pitch of sound, investigate ways to absorb sound and recognise how vibrations travel through a medium to the ear.
