English

As readers, we will be using our inference and deduction skills to justify answers. We will predict what might happen next based on what we have read and what we know.

As writers, we will be producing different genres of writing based around the books 'The Wild Robot' by Peter Brown and 'The Tear Thief' by Carol Ann Duffy. We will developing our writing skills through producing adventure narratives, setting descriptions, character descriptions, letters, play scripts, poems, non-chronological reports, newspaper reports and persuasive adverts.

Maths

As mathematicians, we will be learning mental and written strategies to solve multiplication and division problems. We will continue to practise our times tables to recall them fluently up to 12x12. We will also be learning about fractions and decimals. We will recognise and show equivalent fractions and add and subtract fractions with the same denominator. We will also recognise and write equivalent decimals of fractions and round decimals with 1 decimal place to whole numbers.

Religious Education

Our RE focus question is 'What do creation stories teach us about caring for the world?'

Spiritual: We will reflect on the awe and wonder

of the world through music, poetry and imagery. Moral: We will discuss the moral responsibility of looking after the world.

Social: We will explore the concept of stewardship within a faith community.

Cultural: We will enquire into stories of creation in different religious traditions and cultures.

Science

As Scientists, we will be learning about living things and their habitats. We will group living things into different ways including using classification keys to group animals. We will also identify vertebrates and invertebrates and describe environmental dangers.

History

As Historians, we will be learning about significant events that have happened in Europe. We will also be learning about the history of some of Europe's most important architecture.

Geography

As Geographers, we will investigate the countries and capitals of Europe. We will look in-depth at key human and physical features as well as climates. We will also use atlases and digital maps to locate the countries and key features.

Computing

In Computing, we will be learning how to use a word processor and text formatting tools as part of the topic 'Writing for different audiences'. We will also be learning how to create animations using software on Purple Mash.
