English

As readers, we will make predictions using inference based on what we have read and what we know. We will make comparisons and find links between our stories and other parts of the curriculum.

As writers, this half term our book are 'Great Expectations' and 'Room 13'. we will write stories, non-chronological reports, letters and diaries continuing to build on our writing skills, punctuation and grammar.

Research the Christian Calendar and consider how important events are celebrated by the Christian community.

History As Historians, we will learn about some significant events that have happened in North America as well as significant people such as Martin Luther King. We will learn about the history of North America's most important architecture.	Geography As Geographers, we will be exploring America looking at the physical features such as the National parks, Rockies, active volcanoes and Tornado Alley. We will also look at the human features such as the skyscrapers and monuments	<u>Computing</u> In Computing, we will be looking at Blogging, Text Adventure and Networks. We will continue to develop our computing skills in other areas of the curriculum to ensure we're confident with using laptops and computers.
French As linguists, the children will apply previous skills and knowledge of topic areas such as places in a town, directions, homes and numbers to develop speaking and listening abilities to be able to have a conversation. The topics this term are 'Let's go Shopping' and 'This is France'.	<u>PE</u> In PE, we will be working with Wigan Athletic on our skills in invasion games. We will play competitive games and apply basic principles for attacking and defending. We will also be working on our skills of running, balancing and catching.	<u>Music</u> As Musicians, we will continue our fortnightly lessons with Mrs Beatty building on our knowledge of musical notes, pitch and rhythm. We will follow Charanga and study the songs, A New Year Carol and You've got a Friend.
PSHE In PSHE, we will be looking at Valuing Difference and Keeping Safe. We will explore the importance of equality and look into how we can keep safe as we get older.	Art and Design As artists, we will study American pop artists such as Andy Warhol and Roy Lichtenstein creating final pieces inspired by them in the medias of digital art and paint.	Design Technology As designers we will design, make and evaluate an electrical alarm system for a high-rise building using our knowledge gathered in science.
