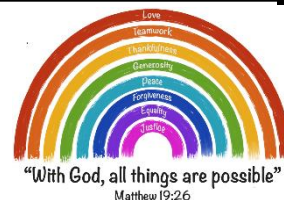




Westleigh Methodist Primary School

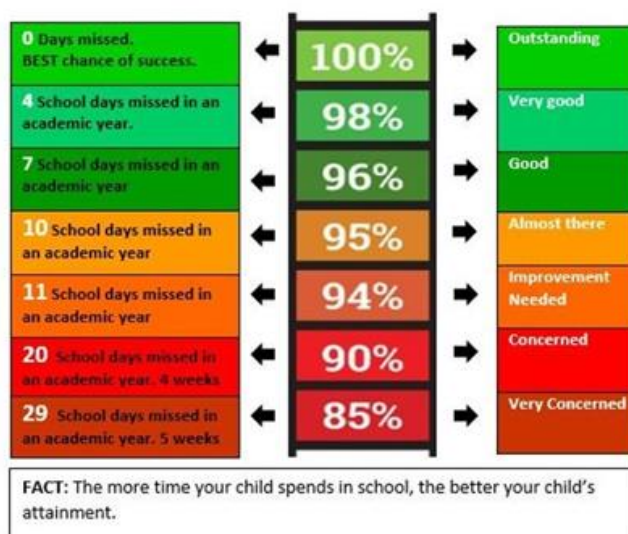
