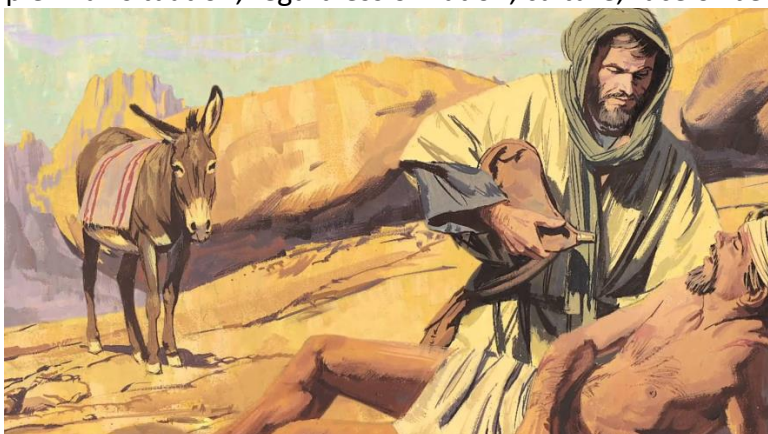
Well done Year
