Thank you for your understanding today on the change to exit doors at home time – your patience was really appreciated.



Let's look at this week's story



Four children have been found alive after surviving a plane crash and spending forty days alone in Colombia's Amazon jungle. Colombia's president, Gustavo Petro heralded the rescue as a joy for the whole country. The four siblings were the only survivors of the plane that crash landed in the jungle on 1st May. They then became the focus of a massive rescue operation, involving soldiers and local people. Speaking of the incredible feat of survival, Gustavo Petro said, 'They were alone, they themselves achieved an example of total survival which will remain in history'

This week in worship the children learnt all about the news story of the four missing children who survived a plane crash in Colombia's Amazon Jungle. The children learnt facts about the Colombian jungle and the rescue mission. They tried to imagine what it was like for different members of the recuse team and the four children. They discussed the different types of bravery that were shown.

They reflected that bravery comes in many forms. Having the support of others can make a big difference to the choices that we make and the courage that we show, when facing difficult and scary situations and experiences.
